The Bahá'í Faith

In just over 100 years, the Bahá'í Faith has grown from an obscure movement in the Middle East to become the second-most widespread of the independent world religions. Embracing people from more than 2,100 ethnic, racial and tribal groups, it is likely the most diverse organized body of people on the planet. *The unity it has achieved within this great diversity challenges prevailing theories about human nature and the prospects for our common future.* It challenges the uncritical assent given to the proposition that human beings are incorrigibly selfish and aggressive and thus incapable of erecting a social system at once progressive and peaceful, dynamic and harmonious, a system giving free play to individual creativity and initiative but based on co-operation and reciprocity.

The mission of the Bahá'í Faith is the achievement of the organic and spiritual unity of the whole body of nations, which will involve the emergence of a world-community, the consciousness of world-citizenship and the founding of a world civilization and culture. It promotes the recognition of the oneness of God, the oneness of religion and the oneness of humanity. Interfaith dialogue and understanding are considered essential to world peace.

Far from aiming at the overthrow of the spiritual foundation of the world's religious systems, its avowed, its unalterable purpose is to widen their basis, to restate their fundamentals, to reconcile their aims, to reinvigorate their life, to demonstrate their oneness, to restore the pristine purity of their teachings, to coordinate their functions and to assist in the realization of their highest aspirations. These divinely-revealed religions, as a close observer has graphically expressed it, "are doomed not to die, but to be reborn... 'Does not the child succumb in the youth and the youth in the man; yet neither child nor youth perishes?""

The aim of Baha'u'llah, the Prophet of this new and great age which humanity has entered upon -- He Whose advent fulfills the prophesies of the Old and New Testament as well as those of the Qur'an and other religious traditions regarding the coming of the Promised One in the end of time, on the Day of Judgement -- is not to destroy but to fulfill the Revelations of the past, to reconcile rather than to accentuate the divergences of the conflicting creeds which disrupt present-day society.

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"A new life is, in this age, stirring within all the peoples of the earth; and yet none hath discovered its cause or perceived its motive....
"... the people are wrapped in a strange sleep!"

"Justice is, in this day, bewailing its plight, and Equity groaneth beneath the yoke of oppression. The thick clouds of tyranny have darkened the face of the earth, and enveloped its peoples. Through the movement of Our Pen of glory We have, at the bidding of the omnipotent Ordainer, breathed a new life into every human frame, and instilled into every word a fresh potency. All created things proclaim the evidences of this world-wide regeneration. This is the most great, the most joyful tidings imparted by the Pen of this wronged One to mankind . . ."

". . .The well-being of mankind, its peace and security, are unattainable unless and until its unity is firmly established. This unity can never be achieved so long as the counsels which the Pen of the Most High hath revealed are suffered to pass unheeded."
